



Arizona Rocks 114

This might be the most unusual of the Arizona Rocks. Recently, reading the newspaper I found an article about how our urine could help sea grass. One article I looked up was "Our pee could help bring back sea grass". The dried urine forms the mineral struvite, which contains phosphorus and nitrogen and these are key ingredients in fertilizers. Experiments found that putting the slow dissolving struvite on sea grass was one of the best methods for restoration.

What does this have to do with Arizona Rocks? In 2016 a new mineral was described from Arizona. It was named rowleyite for the Rowley Mine where it was found. The Rowley Mine north of Gila Bend is a well-known Arizona locality with collectors for its wulfenite specimens. A photograph of Rowley wulfenite is on the cover of the new edition of the Mineralogy of Arizona. Struvite is one of the minerals found with the rowleyite so struvite has been added to the Arizona mineral list and that is why the article caught my attention.

It is thought that the struvite and rowleyite probably formed from decaying bat guano, which was the source of the organic material. Finally, I am putting the chemical formulas for struvite and rowleyite here, especially rowleyite, so you don't have to ask me what the formulas are, because they are complex. Struvite is (NH₄)Mg(PO₄).6H₂O and rowleyite is [Na(NH₄,K)₉Cl₄][V₂^{5+,4+}(P,As)O₈]₆.n[H₂O,Na,NH ₄,K,Cl]. If you need more information, go to mindat.org.
